

PopUp Stack

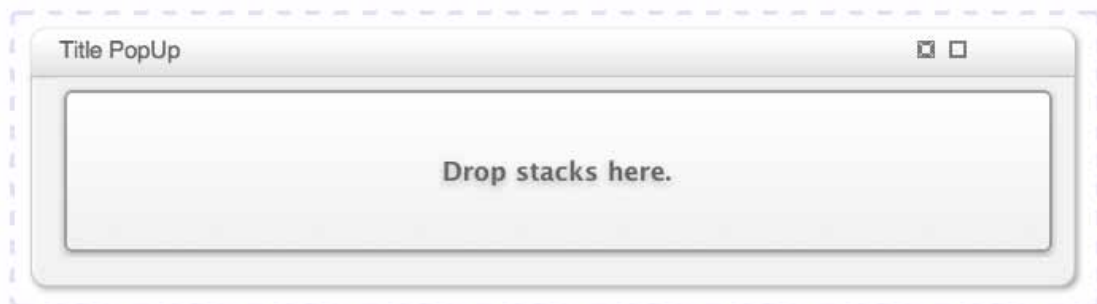

This PopUp stack is a very powerful stack for RapidWeaver. With this manual and the movie on my website (www.idsign-shop.com) you can create a PopUp on your site in 5 minutes. But if you are skilled with css and image editing (not for dummies) you can make your own skins and link it (more information in this manual). To start working with the PopUp stack you just have to drop a PopUp stack on your page and you're started.

How does it work?

Start by installing the "PopUp" stack and restart RapidWeaver for the new stack to become available. Switch into edit mode and drag the **PopUp** stack into your stacks page. You will see this:



HOW TO USE THE POPUP INFOPANEL

If you already loaded the latest JQuery script unmark the checkbox "Incl. JQuery"
Always include once the PopUp script !!

So if you drop a second PopUp unmark both checkboxes.

1) Give every PopUp a original ID (1 the next 2 then 3 and so on)

2) Click Start PopUp Open if you want this popup to be open on page enter (do not mark the Start Iconized checkbox ! - only use one function - default = closed, Start Open and Start iconized)

3) Give your PopUp a title and color

4) Position PopUp = where the PopUp opens on your page. Use (for example):
top:100px; left: 100px
to position each PopUp

5) PopUp Height and Width when you open your popup.

6) PopUp Skin: there are 3 skins available: default, white and black (be careful if you type in these words - case sensitive !!)
There is also a Extra PopUp available (yourPopUp): but that one you have to install (more info later in this manual)

7) Link CSS Skin: You only have to use this if you install the "yourPopUp" skin or a skin you made !!! Drop the included yourPopUp.css file in the assets and link it. If you make a skin (examples included -> see download file) modify also the name and input from the yourPopUp.css to match your style)

So if you drop a second PopUp unmark both checkboxes.

8) Mark this checkbox if you don't want a icon (on the top left site from the popup)

Attention!! if you mark this checkbox you can't use the iconized function !!!

9) Make your one Icon (More info in this  manual)

10) PopUp Action = each Character stands for a button: m = minified

c = close

i = iconize



If you don't want the iconize function, just type in: m,c

11) Additional buttons "hide Fullscreen button" and "Hide Center Button"

Attention if you hide one of these two buttons (and one of the others - point 10) check in preview the position from the buttons with "Position button"

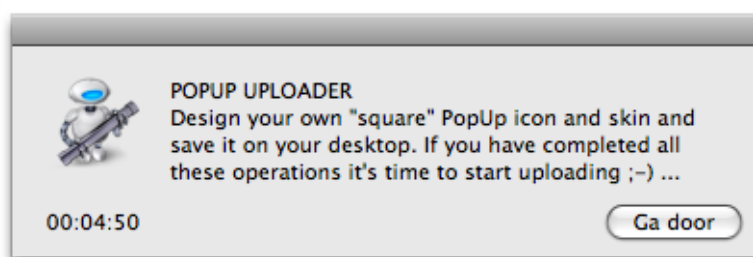
HOW TO MAKE A ICON UPLOAD IT AND LINK IT

First: make your own icon or download one (free icons available on the web). Check if the image is a square image. 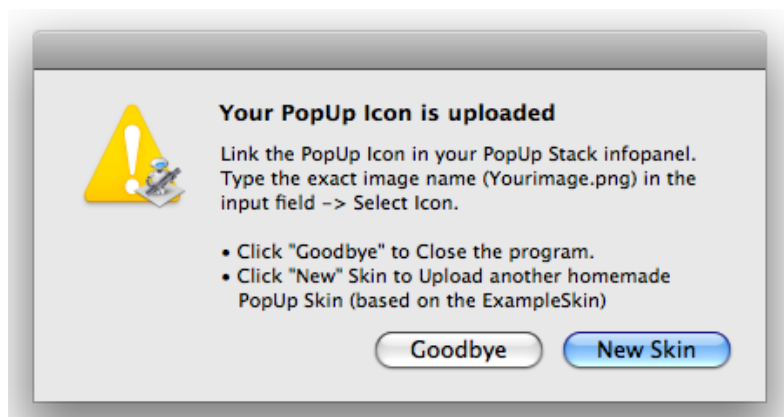

UPLOAD YOUR ICON WITH POPUP-UPLOADER

First: make your own icon or download one (free icons available on the web). Check if the image is a square image. Open the PopUp-Uploader, you'll see the next window:



Click: Continue, and select your icon (square) - click choose, you'll see the next window :



Click: Goodbye if you don't want to upload a homemade skin. You only have to link the icon in the info panel (attention type in the link correctly = case sensitive)

UPLOAD YOUR ICON WITH THE INCLUDED ALIAS: “DROP HERE YOUR ICON”

First: make your own icon or download one (free icons available on the web). Check if the image is a square image and scale the height and width to 48px!!! Now drop your icon on the alias and link it in the info panel (point 9 from the infopanel) **ATTENTION IT'S CASE SENSITIVE !!!!**

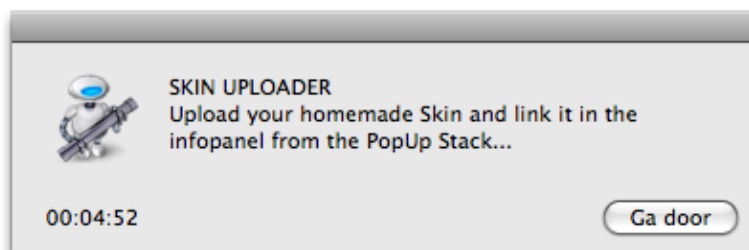

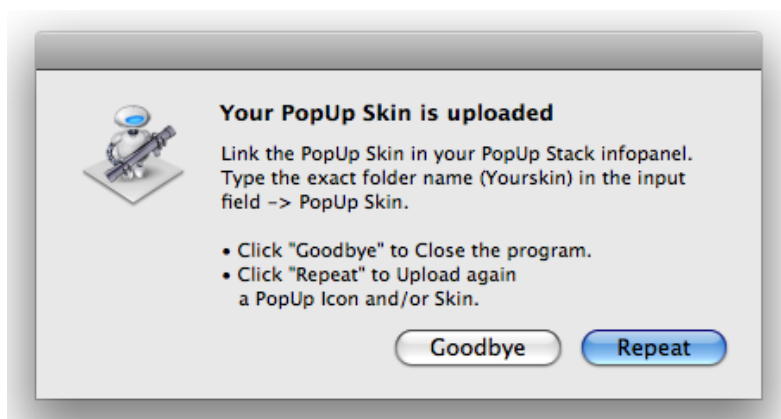
UPLOAD YOUR SKIN WITH POPUP-UPLOADER

First: make your own skin (examples included, use the folder "yourPopUp" and replace the images with the one you made (don't change the names)). Inside the folder "Templates and icons" you'll find some icon and skin examples. Rename the "yourPopUp" folder with a original name and use this name (without spaces) also for the css file (example: yourPopUp.css) Change the css if necessary. Make also a original Icon for your homemade popup skin.

Open the PopUp-Uploader and follow the procedure to upload your icon don't click goodbye but continue to upload your skin, you'll see the next window:



Click: Continue, and select your skin folder - click choose, you'll see the next window :



Click: Goodbye if you don't want to upload a second homemade skin and icon.

You only have to link the icon in the info panel (attention type in the link correctly = case sensitive), the skin (in the PopUp skin input field) and drop the modified homemade css file in the assets and link it in the input field: Link CSS skin

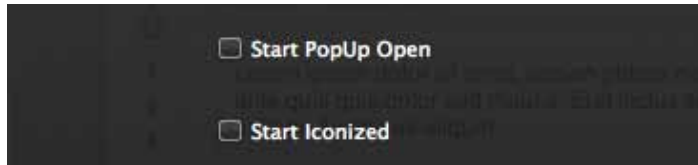
UPLOAD YOUR SKIN WITH THE INCLUDED ALIAS: “DROP HERE YOUR SKIN FOLDER”

First: make your own skin folder (example included). Change the included CSS filename into your skin name (modify the css if necessary) Now drop your skin on the alias and link it in the info panel **ATTENTION IT'S CASE SENSITIVE !!!!** Next you have to drop the CSS file in the assets and link it in the infopanel from the PopUp stack. Use a standard icon or make one yourself (don't forget to link it in the info panel)

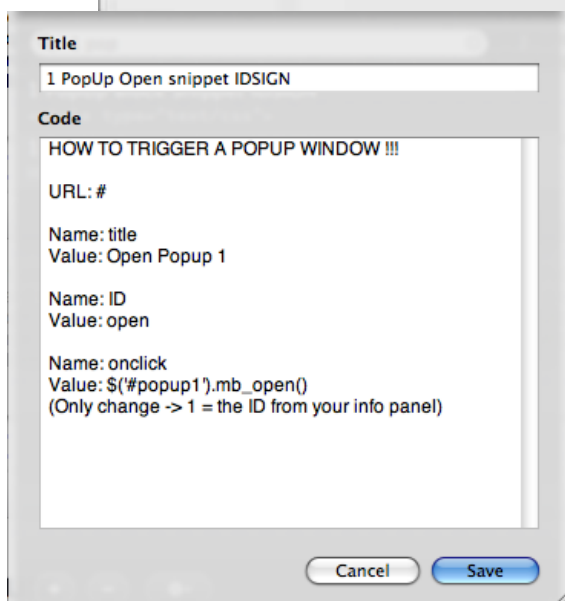
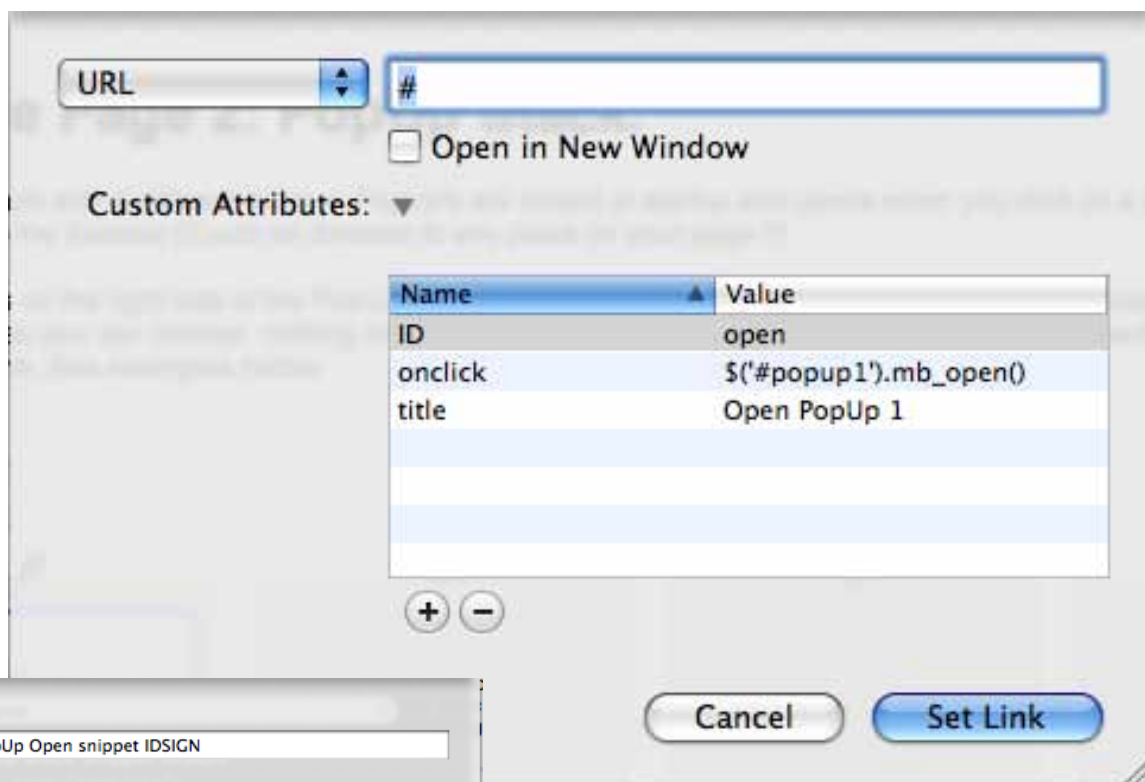
TRIGGER A TEXTBLOCK OR IMAGE TO OPEN A POPUP WINDOW

If you have unmarkt the checkboxes:



You can trigger a text or image to open a PopUp window. Click on the item and make a link: this window will open: Type in what you see on this image or install the snippet i included.

Only change the title and the number behind #popup (= the id you have put in the infopanel)



Included: snippet

WHERE DOES THE POPUP HAVE TO ICONIZE

You just have to insert a snippet on the place you want the popup's to iconize (could be in the sidebar, inside another div, on the body and so on.... You can style that div with CSS.
